

CRC TiME Distinguished Paper Award 2024

Nominations are now open for the CRC TiME Distinguished Paper Award.

This award recognises excellence in peer-reviewed research conducted by CRC TiME authors.

Nominations are open to CRC TiME researchers and partner organisations only.

Nominations are open until 5pm AWST on Friday 28 June 2024.

The winner will be announced at the CRC TiME Annual Forum dinner on 20 August in Brisbane.

About the Award

Publishing research through high quality peer reviewed processes is fundamental to sharing and building on the global research knowledge base. CRC TiME values the publication of research in the peer reviewed literature and this award will recognise the most distinguished paper published over the last year based on its novelty, research quality, clarity in presentation and potential impact. Peer-reviewed papers conducted by CRC TiME researchers may be submitted for consideration by the Awards Committee. These include papers based on:

- Individual CRC TiME projects
- Comparisons between CRC TiME projects
- Research conducted in the course of CRC TiME-funded student theses
- Ideas generated through CRC TiME events (e.g. workshops and forums)

Eligible publications include **peer-reviewed** chapters in an edited collection, journal articles and conference papers.

The Distinguished Paper award recipient will receive a prize of \$1500 to spend on professional development.

Eligibility criteria

All nominations must meet the following eligibility criteria:

1. Papers led by CRC TiME authors as part of CRC TiME projects/theses/events
2. Approved by CRC TiME for publication including completion of a CRC TiME Request to Publish form
3. Been through an external peer-review process
4. Published (or accepted for publication) by an indexed journal or conference proceedings
5. Published (or accepted for publication) between October 2023 and June 2024)

Assessment Criteria

Nominations will be assessed based on the following criteria:

1. Novelty of topic
2. Quality of research
3. Clarity of writing (concise, readable)
4. Potential impact for CRC TiME partners and stakeholders
